When: Friday, 8/21

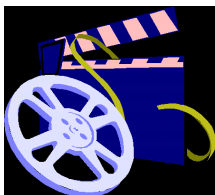
Time: 5pm – 9pm

Host: American Cancer Society

What: This is an annual event that is hosted by the American Cancer Society, an organization that searches for a cure to cancer; this event is used to help raise money for their research on cancer. Each team that attends RFL must have at least one person walking around the track throughout the 24 hours. (Thus, the team members rotate out and take turns walking around- with friends of course!). Walking around the track symbolizes the ongoing battle against cancer.

Why: Not only can you help assist in finding a cure to cancer, you can also spend time with your fellow key club members AND members from different districts/schools as well. This is a fun event that is beneficial to our community and a great time to socialize!

NOTE: To attend this event, you must:

- bring a photo ID in case a counselor needs to check it

Campbell Relay for Life

Everyone knows that cancer is one of the major reasons people die across the nation. Because of this, we have the American Cancer Society to help those in need.

Every year, the ACS hosts an event nationwide called the Relay for Life. Participants form teams and each team keeps at least one person on the track for the whole 24 hours of the event to symbolize the perpetual fight against cancer.

Every year, our Key Club attends first the Campbell, Relay for Life. This year, we formed team PengWIN with Gunn Key club, with a total of 38 members, to participate in the Campbell Relay for Life on July 11-12, 2009.

Throughout the summer (until the Relay), we raised money through dinner fundraisers, going door-to-door, selling baked goods, and running carwashes. These team events, along with individual fundraising allowed our team to contribute over \$5000.

Additionally, we were able to contribute to the Relay itself by

volunteering with setup, and the Luminaria ceremony, during which participants remember those who have passed away from cancer.
